- wash your hands regularly

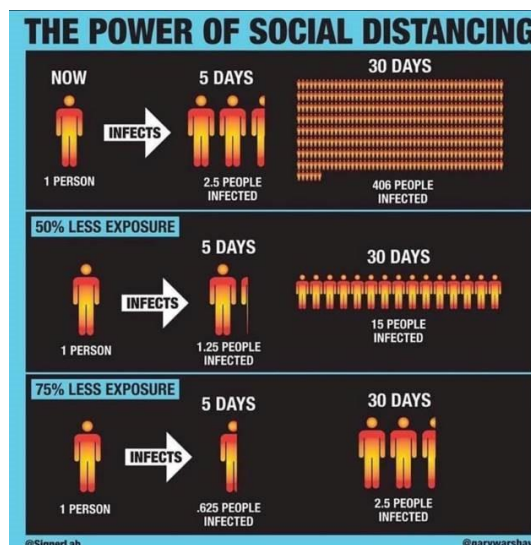
Do not leave home if you or anyone in your household has symptoms.'

We are also in communication with the Local Authority, Warrington Borough Council (WBC) and following local guidance so that we can reopen when it is safe to do so.

Those with older children will be aware that schools were due to open to more children from 1st June and that WBC issued a letter on 20 May 2020 asking schools not to open to more children until 8th June to enable more rigorous risk assessments and allow more time for safety measures to be implemented. Following reporting of high R numbers (infection rates) in the North West on Friday 5th June, they also decided on Sunday 7th June to postpone the phased reopening of schools. The Local Authority will be holding a further meeting later on this week to review their decision for Warrington schools.

With the safety of the children and our staff as a key priority, we anticipate that we will not be reopening until September.
